Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
<b>What is the overall deductible?</b>	In-network: <b>\$3,000</b> /individual and <b>\$6,000</b> /family  Out-of-network: <b>\$7,000</b> /individual and <b>\$14,000</b> /family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> . Unless a <u>copay</u> , fee, or other percent is shown, the <u>coinsurance</u> percent of the <u>allowed amount</u> that you pay for most services is 20% <u>in-network</u> and 50% <u>out-of-network</u> .
<b>Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?</b>	Yes. <u>Preventive care</u> ; <u>primary care</u> and <u>specialist</u> office visits; tier 1 <u>prescription drugs</u> ; <u>urgent care</u> visits; mental health office visits; <u>hospice services</u> ; child eye exams; and children’s dental check-ups are covered before you meet your deductible. Children’s eyeglasses are covered <u>in-network</u> before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven’t yet met the annual deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply.  For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive</u> services without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . <b>Are there other deductibles for specific services?</b>	No.	You don’t have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
<b>What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan?</b>	In-network: <b>\$6,450</b> /individual and <b>\$12,900</b> /family  Out-of-network: <b>\$14,000</b> /individual and <b>\$28,000</b> /family	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members on this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.
<b>What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?</b>	<u>Premiums</u> and costs for health care this <u>plan</u> doesn’t cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don’t count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .

Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Yes. See <a href="http://www.azblue.com">www.azblue.com</a> or call 1-877-475-8440 for a list of <u>in-network providers</u> .	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the <u>plan's network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the <u>provider's</u> charge and what your plan pays ( <u>balance billing</u> ). Be aware your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

- Experimental and investigational treatments except as stated in plan
- Eyewear except as stated in plan
- Fertility and infertility medication and treatment

- Genetic and chromosomal testing except as stated in plan
- Long-term care, except long-term acute care
- Massage therapy other than allowed under medical coverage guidelines

**Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes**

Minimum Essential Coverage generally includes plans, health insurance available through the Marketplace or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of Minimum Essential Coverage, you may not be eligible for the premium tax credit.

**Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Not Applicable**

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.





## About These Coverage Examples



**This is not a cost estimator.** Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

### Peg is Having a Baby

(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- The plan's overall deductible \$3,000
- Specialist copayment \$75
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 20%
- Other coinsurance 20%

Specialist office visits (*prenatal care*)

### Managing Joe's Type 2 Diabetes

(a year of routine in-network care of a well-controlled condition)

- The plan's overall deductible \$3,000
- Specialist copayment \$75
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 20%
- Other coinsurance 20%

Primary care physician office visits (*including disease education*)  
Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)  
Prescription drugs  
Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

<b>Total Example Cost</b>	<b>\$5,600</b>
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**In this example, Joe would pay:**

<u>Deductibles</u>	\$50
<u>Copayments</u>	\$330
<u>Coinsurance</u>	\$840
<i>What isn't covered</i>

### Mia's Simple Fracture

(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- The plan's overall deductible \$3,000
- Specialist copayment \$75
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 20%
- Other coinsurance 20%

Emergency room care (*including medical supplies*)  
Diagnostic test (*x-ray*)  
Durable medical equipment (*crutches*)  
Rehabilitation services (*physical therapy*)

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**In this example, Mia would pay:**

<u>Copayments</u>	\$150

<b>The total Mia would pay is</b>	<b>\$2,450</b>
